We will review all submitted abstracts, and then structure the program to provide plenty of time for lively discussion around each topic. Please feel free to contact us if you would like to have our thoughts about a topic you might present.

The Thursday and Friday meeting sessions will follow a morning schedule, leaving the afternoons free for you to explore the island at your leisure.
